



Hi Gang!

Doing any winter flying? A lot of people keep in practice, by flying through the winter months when the occasional nice day manages to sneak in. But you have to be ready when it happens, you just can't run home and put your plane on charge, tomorrow will probably rain.

This is why you see a big turnover in trickle chargers at the hobby shops. ACE R/C has a neat little unit in a small white box with selective switches and indicator lights that can be put in your chargers transmitter and receiver lines with very little trouble, if you follow the instructions. The instructions are very clear and complete, but if you should have any problems you can always ask some of us experts(?) out here, we'll be glad to help. "Pass me the solder Igor."

This unit, or any other type, can be switched to trickle charge after you give it a full charge first. This is great for having an airplane ready to fly winter or summer- anytimel It can be left on indefinitely, it won't hurt the batteries at all, but you should still cycle the batteries every month or two, just to be on the safe side.

Just as a footnote to last month's column, I've been reading the instructions first and going over the plans for my Great Planes Super Skybolt. It gives the option of one servo for the ailerons or two servos if you plan to put ailerons on both wings.

I took one look at the thickness of the wing and said..."oh, oh!" There was barely room for the servos themselves. Where were the mounts suppose to go?

Well, Great Planes had designed a neat and tidy installation for that servo. They put in the cover screw mounts and that was all, they installed the servo on the cover itself. A 1/16 inch ply cover with basswood arms glued to it's surface for the servo to be mounted on. Remove the cover, you remove the servo also, pretty neat. I will more than likely add small triangles of ply to the

basswood for more support, just to be safe, if there's room.

How's your soldering? Having problems or does it just flow neatly just as you want it to?

Hah! I know how to solder and it still doesn't always flow neatly for me. It usually comes down to something I forgot to do or I was in a hurry and didn't think I needed to do it.

Well, here's my suggestions anyway. If its wire for servo leads, use a pencil iron of about 25 - 37 watts. Anything higher than that could cause your trimmed leads to become awfully long, that insulation will back up faster than you think.

Start by trimming the insulation off the wire carefully, then "tin" the lead by heating the wire end and letting solder run into it.

Before you join both pieces of wire, slip some appropriate size heat-shrink tubing over one wire, solder the wires together, then slide the heat-shrink tubing over the joint and use your heat gun to shrink it tight. This is much better than taping it which will eventually loosen. If you're soldering a whole harness of more wires, slip a piece of heat-shrink tube big enough to cover all wires on first. Then add the small pieces for the individual wires. Solder your joints, heat-shrink them with the small pieces, then slip the larger heat -shrink over the whole thing and shrink it tight with your heat gun.

If you're preparing to solder your landing gear or a wye for the split elevator, clean the area to be soldered with alcohol very thoroughly, including the wrapping wire.

Take some fine sandpaper and sand all pieces to be soldered, including the wrapping wire until they shine completely...all over. Wrap tightly, and flux and use silver solder if you want strength. Do not omit the wrapping wire! Solder does not have the strength of brazing or welding, it needs that support.

Now heat the area to be soldered with a soldering gun or propose torch, don't over do it! Just heat till the solder runs over that area when it is applied to it. Make sure the other side is done also. Don't play with it because eventually you'll screw it up if you do.

After it cools, wash the flux residue off with alcohol again. Remember, the work must be clean, wash, sand, wash again. Heat alone won't do it!






