### FROM THE PMAC NEWSLETTER:

### DID YOU KNOW?

Lockheed Aircraft Corp, builders of the Vega, the P-38, the Constellation, the U-2, the SR-71 and the F-117 Stealth fighters, once, back in the late 1920's. was a division of a large aviation conglomerate with headquarters in Detroit, known as the Detroit Aircraft Corp (DAC). The Detroit-Lockheed YP-24, a trend setting two place fighter was designed and built in Detroit with test flights being done at Grosse Ile Airport.

Jack Northrup, then chief engineer for Lockheed, designed the famous Lockheed Vega aircraft about this time. The Detroit Group Engineers, with Jerry Vultee as chief engineer, designed an all-aluminum fuselage for the Vega, built them in Detroit and shipped them to Califoria for final assembly at the Lockheed factory. Nine Vega airplanes of this derivitive (DL-1) were built. In addition, two aluminum fuselages were built for the DL-2 Sirus and DL-2A Altair, low wing versions of the Vega.

Read about this fascinating chapter of aviation in the June/July issue of the Great Lakes Pilots News, obtainable at Wymans Pilot Shop, on Highland Rd. at Oakland-Pontiac Airport.

I find that the Great Lakes Aviation News is an excellent source of information for lesser known facts about aviation in the great lakes region. Such as a three part series on the history of the Stinson Aircraft Co. which was located in Wayne MI, a two part series on the Maule Aircraft. Their little factory was located S.E. of Jackson MI. Once, a long time ago, while flying crosscountry in an Aeronca 7AC and bucking strong headwinds, I stopped for fuel at the Napoleon Airport near Manchester MI and found I was at the small Maule factory, a family enterprise. Maule airplanes are still being built - but not in Michigan.

Great Lakes Aviation News also did a three part series on the Myers Aircraft Co. formerly located at Tecumsee, Mi. Once I had an opportunity, circa 1948, to buy a Myers MAC-145 for \$2400, a two place airplane with retract gear that had a cruising speed of 162 MPH at altitude, and originally sold new for around \$5600, the price for a nice home back then. Only 20 of the MAC-145 were ever built and most are still flying. Very recently I saw one at Oakland-Pontiac Airport. It was a replica prototype. Some people are planning to put it back into production. A tribute to a fine airplane.

Myers later built the Meyers 200, a four place speedster highly prized by Movie Stars. You put the money up front and Al Meyers and his small group of craftsman would build you an airplane, with delivery a year or so away. Most are still flying and are traded like rare autos. Prior to WWII Myers also built the Dart airplane, a (2) place, low wing, radial engine, stubby airplane designed by Al Mooney.

Great Lakes Aviation News also writes feature articles on pioneering pilots and historical events. A good source of information for the aviation buff.

### Skymasters information

Skymasters (AMA club # 970) field is located within the Bald Mountain State park (see the map). State park stickers are required and can be obtained from the Park Station located on Greenshield road which is couple of miles south of Scripps road on M-24. Flying is permitted from 10AM to 8PM. The noise limit for 1996 is 96Db at 10'. This noise rule is strictly enforced.

Students are encouraged at any time and co-ordination with a flight instructor may be advisable during week days. During the summer months Wednesday evenings is student night and there are usually instructors around all afternoon. Student night is also 'pot-luck' buffet night so that you can fly-n-feed (though not usually at the same time). Chief Flight Instructor: Pete Foss 810-652-8756, Assistant Chief Flight Instructor: Graham Overton 810-628-1651.

From June to August Club meetings are held at the field on the first Saturday of the month at 12 noon - a great chance to fly and gossip too! Winter meetings are held at Larson Middle School (on Long Lake just east of John R - see map) on the second and fourth Wednesday of the month and they start at 7:30PM. Show and tell, coffee and donuts, and model-speak are the order of the evening. Come along - they are fun.
