VOLUNTEERS. Do you want to know who I think first-class volunteers are? Look at your board. With the exception of myself and some added positions, these are the same folks as 2002! NEW FIELD SEARCH. Darrel Watts, Gary Weaks and others have been spearheading the search for new, additional fields. I totally support their approach and reasoning behind obtaining new fields. I'm also looking for additional ideas for fundraising for when these projects come to fruition. As we voted in last month, there are dues increases for 2003 that should cover these added costs. There is increasing congestion around our field, and I don't see any changes to this trend. Field encroachment is, unfortunately a nationwide trend, and it isn't going to go away. On a positive note, I strongly believe that it's not

what you know but who you know. We have strong **relations** with most of our residential neighbors, the parks (Thank you Bill Stark!) and if we follow our own rules, I for esee no pitfalls. The right people are becoming familiar with us, and I believe that the right kind of familiarity can more readily translate into someone that supports you.

PRESS & NOISE. In the interests of getting more people familiar with us, I plan on getting more press this year at some of our events. Perhaps if we can portray what we are doing as a sport more than a hobby, we might be perceived differently. The average person thinks that these little airplanes that we fly are the cutest things! When relatives of mine see for the first time a 14x6 APC prop wind up 9,500rpm, their perceptions change: rather than cute, this airplane becomes seriously cool! Combined with safety and common sense, you have an R/C candidate. The survey results that Darrell compiled last year are in good hands. One of the questions dealt with noise. Like the club. I believe that 94db will work for now. We're all thinking about it - but we need to make sure we are at 94db! More on that later.

Last year, I made a conscious effort to visit as many clubs I could in a visitor capacity. I flew at quite a few events both run under AMA and IMAA (I'm a member of IMAA also). After this experience, I've got to tell you that we have a real good thing here with the Skymasters group. I mean this both with the field quality, the people in our club and the quality of the events that

we run. We have a diverse group and I think the average member is a welcome individual here. what I would call "normal" airplanes here, in a "normal" fashion. Skymasters has a few people that buy \$ 200.00 props and some that don't use props. A lot of the clubs have only one or the other. I personally, like this diverse approach. Now if we could do something about the people that give scale pilots (like myself) grief every time we nose in a Warbird on landing/takeoff/taxi we would really have something!!! No club is perfect after all!


FLYING PIZZA BOX...

The October R/C Report magazine has a detailed article of a novelty 40 size fun flyer, based mainly on a two foot square of Coroplast.

I built mine using stuff laying around my workshop, for approximately \$4.00 as I had a spare radio, O.S.40LA, tank, prop, etc. The Coroplast cost me \$1.00 from a local sign shop. It cost me 80 cents for 2 little Caesars pizza boxes. The article calls it a flying pizza box so you can pick your favorite brand of pizza.

I won't belabor you with the unbelievable





izza NOTE: Wing, Elevons, Fin, and Rudder are 4mm Coroplast. It includes complete plans and couple dozen video clips on how to hand catch retrieves, hovering, near vertical ascents and descents, using a folding chair as a launch platform etc..

You can become the only kid on the block to have a 40 size 3D back yard flyer. The "PBF" is popular with some clubs having organized fun fly events with their "PBF"s . Hoping this story was of interest to you.

with the DNR.


For many years Steve has stored and maintained the club trailers at his home. He was integrally involved in developing the Scripps Road field, including excavation, road development, building the shelter and more.

Skymasters Information.....

Skymaster's field is located within the Bald Mountain State

Park on Scripps Road (see map). State Park Permits are required and can be obtained from the Park Headquarters located on Greenshield Road or at club events. Flying is permitted from 10 AM to 8 PM. The noise limit for 2003 is 94 dBa at 10 feet-this noise rule strictly enforced.

In the summer, Wednesday evenings are Student Nights and there are usually instructors around all day. Stu-

dent night is also a pot luck buffet, bring som ething for the grill & a dish to pass. Meet the Instructors and arrange for more instruction time gether on other days. Our Chief Flight Instructor is Ron Sokacz (810) 977-1404.

From June to August, Club meetings are held at the field, on the first Saturday of the month at 12 Noon. A great chance to fly and socialize. Winter meetings—September to May—are held at Larson Middle School (on Long Lake just east of John R—see map). On the second and fourth Wednesday of the month at 7:30 PM. Bring a model for Show and Tell, enjoy coffee with donuts and listen to the speaker of the evening.
