I mentioned last month the possibility of a public meeting in Detroit that would

be discussing the potential land swap. That meeting was held and was between Orion Township officials, their lawyers and the State of Michigan, Department of Natural Resources and the party that wishes the land swap to commence. Both parties stated their views in from of the South Eastern Michigan Council Of Governments

(SEMCOG) who is in an advisory position in matters where land use and zoning is concerned. SEM-COG passed a resolution opposing the land swap as it now stands.

They would like to see the "Parkland" in Oakland Township purchased outright, rather than traded with the land we are on in Orion Township. I attended the meeting and got a real education as to how these things work.

As the SEMCOG committee members were made up of mayors, township officials and city supervisors, they were rather sympathetic to what Orion Township is going through with the State of Michigan. Their decision is a mark against the resume of this land swap proposal,

- ? <u>Please register early!</u> This aids our planning of the event and keeps the last minute paperwork to a minimum. Entry fee is non-refundable unless event is cancelled. Information: www.skymasters.org
- ? Registration opens at 8:30am, flying hours are 9:30am till 4:00pm each day. New planes may fly before 9:00 am, to comply with AMA safety code.
- ? There will be pilots meetings each day held at 9:00 am. Check your pilots envelope for more flying rules. The Director will decide the flight pattern direction each day.
- ? You may pit anywhere on the flight line, engines may *only* be started on the beach starting blocks.
- ? Transmitter and frequency pins are to be returned to the impound area immediately after use or if you are waiting for your aircraft to be retrieved by the chase boat. Total time a transmitter may be out of the impound area is 30 minutes, including flight time. *Please notify the impound area if you are leaving the flying site with your transmitters.*
- ? The Saturday Night's "BEST EATS ON THE BEACH" ~ PIG ROAST will be at 5:00pm. Tickets are \$8.00 in advance. Enter number of tickets on entry form.
