

Teo Terry - House of Balsa PT – 19 .25 - .32 Power converted to electric. The wingspan is 50 in with 414 sq. in of wing area. Powered by a Hacker A30-10XL with 10-11 GP 2000Nimh batteries. Teo is using a 10X7 or a 11x7 prop at 300-350 watts




Pete Foss – RT Models Canadair 415 with twin geared Astro 05 brushed motors. Fuse is fiber-glassed balsa while the wing is covered with dope and silkspan.



Greg Cardillo – Three Vince Pettke built Arrows. Also designed by Laddie Mikulasko, the Arrow is much lighter than his Northstar because you don't need to add nose weight. Vince also built Greg a 1/2 size electric version and a 25 sized version for Pete Foss. All three planes were clearly built by a true craftsman, the workmanship is amazing. Hopefully all three will be ready for the fall float fly.

Greg hold Ron Sokacz's – Macchi Schneider Cup racer. Weight: about 7.5 pounds, powered by a Saito 80.



Joe Rubinstein – Version 3 of the Savoia-Marchetti S.55 twin hull 80" wing span float plane. Two Astro 05 brushless motors with 2 - 4 cell lithium packs. The engineering by Joe and Joe Finklestein of the wing ensures proper washout through accurate laser cutting.



David Wendt and Joe Finkelstine – Both brought nearly finished FW 190 wings. The wings were built from Roy Vaillancourt plans. Joe also brought his Saito 450 power plant and the fiber-glass fuselage.

Our last event of the year! Whether snow and ice; or maybe a sunny day - one of our most popular events. Come join us for some hot chili and weather permitting - flying to end the year




