Don't taxi into the pits. Taxi parallel to the flight line and shut off your engine without pointing the beast in toward people. It could have been much worse.

I have a request for the heli pilots (remember I was one and will be one again some day). When there are other pilots flying do not come close to the flight stations when flying a pattern or doing maneuvers. Keep the machine centered in the runway. It is down right frightening to have the machine be that close when you are flying, especially when it comes out of no where. Think of the other guy please.

(From the AMA RC Safety code rule 7: With the exception of events flown under official AMA Competition Regulations rules, excluding takeoff and landing, no powered model may be flown outdoors closer than 25 feet to any individual, except for the pilot and the pilot's helper(s) located at the flightline. - Pete)
