For example Dean Pappas, who writes the Aerobatic column, had a great article on determining the mean aerodynamic cord (MAC) which is necessary to determine the correct C/G.







Dear Joe,

I have just received my April issue of *Model Aviation*. The front cover brought back a flood of recent memories concerning the Tuskegee Airmen and their great story in American history.

The photos and story within *Model Aviation* are the best example of why AMA exists. The sharing of a very important part of a sometimes not so proud aspect of American history, the Tuskegee Airmen with your club was excellent. The involving of the youth in the project (I noticed the common last name of Hass in the photo with Col. Jefferson) is what its all about, passing on our love of flying to the next generation.

On a personal note, my father was a Pearl Harbor survivor of the battle of Leyte Gulf in Oct of 1944. He was on the USS St. Lo, the first ship to be sunk by a kamikaze pilot. Because of this I have always been a history buff of WWII. About four years ago I was traveling with my wife of two weeks and my 11year old stepson. As we waited to board a plane to Denver I noticed an older gentleman with one of those baseball caps that have a ship or other type on military denotation on them. This cap said "Tuskegee Airman". I introduced my self to the gentleman and asked if he was indeed a "Tuskegee Airman". He said he was and I introduced my stepson to this living legend. I was to find out that the annual meeting of the Tuskegee Airmen was being held at the same hotel complex where I was headed for a convention. Needless to say I attended more of their forums than my convention.

To recognize the accomplishments of the past, to expose this to our youth and get them involved in flying, I'm sure that the Executive Council would agree when I say well done Skymasters! You are an outstanding example of an AMA Chartered Club.

Merlin Glow Plugs by David Wendt

Date: Wednesday March 14, 2007

Location: Larson Middle School

40 people were in attendance.

Club President Joe Hass opened the meeting:

Guest Speaker - Al Kelly of Merlin Glow Plugs. Al explained fuel has a lot to do with the longevity of the plug. Adding a small amount of caster oil to your fuel will help the longevity of a plug. Furthermore 2 stroke plugs should be changed after about 2 and 3 gallons of fuel. Four stroke plugs can last up to 8 gallons. Plugs work via a catalectic reaction. A reaction exists between the alcohol in our fuel and the platinum wire in our plugs. The reaction is what causes the heat needed to start combustion. The temperatures get between 1500 and 2100 degrees inside our engines. If your plug is a hot plug it has a 1/8" bore and if it is a cold plug it will most likely have a 3/32" bore. Sport airplanes run between 7,000 and 16,000 RPM depending upon the stroke. Most of the engines Al runs are pylon racers running from 140 mph to 180 mph, spinning propellers at a rate approaching 35,000 rpm. Glow plugs need to be replaced after each run when driving an engine at top RPM levels. Our sport planes are far more forgiving because of the low RPM speeds.
