The A123s have many unique advantages to Li-Pos as we now know them. I have a great deal on some NiCad power packs (that we used to power the motor systems in our electric airplanes). Talk about technology moving at warp speed.

### A123 Cells with Ken Meyers

Ken Meyers, President and Newsletter Editor of the EFO club, spent a very enjoyable evening with us on March 12 to discuss A123 batteries. These new batteries are a type of lithium battery with some important differences. Unlike LiPo batteries, they are cylindrical and have a metal can. They are also quite a bit heavier than LiPo's and only come in two sizes so far.

Their maximum voltage is also different from LiPo batteries and must be charged with chargers made for that technology. In the special case of a three cell A123 pack, they can be charged with a 12 volt battery and some lamp or zip cord in a very short time!
