Danny overcame the loss of his aircraft in a mid air during practice. With a borrowed airplane and a missed call, resulting in a zero for that maneuver on his third flight, he stayed focused and flew to win on his 4th flight. A great accomplishment for a 13 year old who has been flying for just over a year. He was the youngest pilots at the Scale NATS.



Three Skymasters are more than winners. They are heroes. On Wednesday, August 6 the skies over our field were filled with helicopters searching for a missing 75 year old women with Alzheimer's. What we didn't know was that it was Dolores Reuter, wife of long time Skymaster, Harold who was missing. On Thursday August 7, Dan and Joy Stolz, Greg Brausa and Joe Rubinstein were at the field. In the quiet after a rain, Greg was the first to hear a faint cry "Help". Then Joe heard it too. They were able to get a fix and proceeded to the area. Oakland County Sheriff officers happened to be at the field and joined the search. Dolores was found about 200 feet west of the entrance to our field, about 200 feet south of Scripps. Joy, an RN, administered first aid until emergency personnel arrived. Dolores had traveled over 1.5 miles through some very rough terrain and had been missing for over 36 hours. She is recovering.

RC at Pontiac Airport Open House

On Sunday, August 17, Skymasters Jim Held and Gary Weaks were part of a select group of RC pilots who were allowed to fly for the hundreds of spectators gathered at the Oakland Pontiac Airport open house. This is an annual event that showcases many aspects of aviation to the public. The RC portion of the open house was hosted by the United Flying Organization (U.F.O.) out of Highland, Michigan. Because the busy airport remained active during the entire day, special NOTAMs and procedures were posted to full-scale and RC pilots. The south runway, 27L / 9R was closed for two 1/2 hour sessions for RC operations while the parallel runway remained active. This required careful skills and planning to avoid any conflicts of the two airspaces. After being cleared by the tower, the RC show began and ended with stunning aerobatic routines by members of the UFO club. Between these demos, Gary with his P-47 and Jim with his P-51 joined Vic Kerster (PMAC) for a giant scale war bird gaggle. Nothing compares to multiple war birds warming up on the ramp together or flying a tight pattern. In addition to full and RC static displays, full scale fly-bys continued through the day with a T-28, a Waco biplane, F-16's from Selfridge, and several other interesting aircraft.


