PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE...

Bill Brundle and Matt Andren did double duty putting on the show for the evening.

The Michigan Wing of the Civil Air Patrol presented the Skymasters with an Award of Appreciation for our work with Aerospace Education. We then recognized George Derderian, our host at Ultimate Soccer for allowing us to fly at his fantastic facility. A small token of our appreciation was given to George to share with his staff.

With only a short time window for demos we then quickly moved to field 2 for some flights. Bill and Matt flew some new releases (Park Flyer WWI and 3D machines) while Chris flew our SE 5 Park Flyer and a Funtana 300. We then moved back to the meeting room for the rest of what Bill and Matt had in store for us. WOW! There were some super airplanes and accessories. It was a privilege to be able to get "up close and personal" to these fine aircraft. We finished the evening raffling off the Seagull Model Extra that Bill and Matt brought along as well as the PTS F-22 Raptor donated by John Hoover of Flight Line Hobby. As the evening ended I asked Bill Brundle what he thought of the Ultimate Soccer site. "Amazing" was all he could say.
