

Skymasters General Meeting Minutes October 12, 2011 Attendance: 46 Members

Greg Cardillo called the meeting to order at 7:00PM

Greg Cardillo welcomed one visitor – Jerry Romito. Greg also informed us the Stony Creek float flying was done for the year.

The major discussion tonight was the introduction of proposed changes to the Skymasters' Constitution and Bylaws. Gary Weaks gave some introductory background on why the changes were being presented to the membership for a vote. Both Gary Weaks and Greg Cardillo coordinated the discussion with the members in attendance on the various topics.

Constitution Proposed Changes - The following changes were approved/not approved.

Article VIII - Committees. The Executive Operating Committee is composed of the current elected officers of the Club. These elected officers will appoint an additional three (3) Executive Operating Committee members which will be brought to the members for approval and will have full voting rights at EOC These appointed meetings. members must be in good standing. Together these officers and members form the Executive Operating Committee. APPROVED AS AMEND-

ED

Article XIII (New) Financial - All financial instruments and accounts, vehicles and items with titles including, but not limited to checkaccounts. savings counts, certificates of deposits, investments, vehicles, trailers, tractors, Pay Pal, debit cards. etc. must be in the name of the club and controlled/managed by the EOC. All accounts are the property of the club and must be in the possession of the Treasurer. Only the President and Treasurer must have access to all financial instruments and accounts with the ability to move money. PROVED AS AMENDED

Article XIV (New) Publications, Electronic Media and Intellectual Property – All publications, electronic media and intellectual property including but not limited to written documents, electronic media, web site, email accounts, social media, etc. must be registered/owned by the club where allowed. Where registration must be in the individual's name, the organization name must be listed where permitted. Such publications, electronic media and intellectual property are controlled/managed by the EOC. Submissions to each and all of the above include the granting to Skymasters a perpetual license to use and alter the submission as needed. The EOC controls the content of such publications, electronic media and intellectual property and

may direct/select/appoint a newsletter editor, web master, social media manager, etc. APPROVED AS AMENDED

Bylaws Proposed Changes -The following changes were approved/not approved.

Article II (page 6) – Regular meetings of the Club are typically scheduled on a monthly basis at the place and time determined by the EOC. However a meeting is mandatory in November to conduct elections and any other necessary business. *APPROVED*

Article III — Financial Obligations — An addition was proposed. (d) All members except honorary members and associate members to pay dues with the exception for hardship cases. NOT APPROVED

Gary Weaks also displayed a trainer plane ARF and associated equipment that has been obtained through the generous donations of the Skymasters members for a local Cub Scout Pack. There will be a presentation made to the Cub Scouts on October 13 at 6:30 PM. The presentation will take place at Flightline Hobby. All members are invited to attend.

The Retiree/Wannabe breakfast will be every first and third Monday of the month beginning October 3.

Greg Cardillo adjourned the meeting at 9:00 PM.

Skymasters Information.....

Skymasters field is located within the Bald Mountain State

Park Road (see map). State Park Permits are required and can be obtained Park from the Headquarters cated on Greenshield Road or at club events. Flying is permitted from 10 AM to 8 PM. The noise limit is 94 dBa at 10 feetthis noise rule is strictly enforced.

In the summer, Wednesday evenings are Student Nights and there are usually instructors around all day. Student night is also a pot luck buffet, bring some-

thing for the grill & a dish to pass. Meet the Instructors and arrange for more instruction time together on other days. Our Chief Flight Instructor is Ron Sokacz (586)977-1404.

From June to August, Club meetings are held at the field, on the s e c o n d Wednesday of

the month at 8 PM . A great chance to fly and socialize. Winter meetings—September to May—are held at Larson Middle School (on Long Lake just east of John R—see map) on the second and fourth Wednesday of the month at 7:00 PM.
